Studied Dictation: (April 22 assessment date) Words 78 Grammar 21

Kehaar went on pecking at the broken pieces of stale bread. Sunday was again, as usual, our sailing day, and we got under way with a stiff breeze, which reminded us that the latter part of the autumn, and time to expect southeasters once more. We beat up against a strong head wind, under reefed topsails, as far as San Juan where we came to anchor nearly three miles from the shore, with slip-ropes on our cables, in the old southeaster style of last winter. On the passage up, we had an old sea-captain on board, who had married and settled in California, and had not been on salt water for more than fifteen years.
