

## Taw Caw Scavenger Hunt

- Listen for Canada geese on the water (during the week listen to recordings every day):

- Find a bird feather.
- Collect leaves in all the fall colors: red, orange, green, yellow, golden, and brown.
- Collect three different kinds of acorns.
- Look for migrating monarch butterflies.
- Watch squirrels to see where they hide their nuts.
- Take a picture of a spider in its web for Ms. Tammy to identify.

Teachers/Drivers - If you see poison ivy or poison sumac, please warn children not to touch it because it causes a painful rash. To the right are photos of it plus the roots that climb trees.

### Poison ivy

- Usually has three broad, spoon-shaped leaves or leaflets, but it can have more. The phrase, "Leaves of three? Let it be." may help you remember what poison ivy looks like.
- A climbing vine or a low, spreading vine sprawling through grass.
- Has bright red leaves and white or cream berries in the autumn.



### Poison sumac

- It is found in wooded, swampy areas.
- Has 7 to 13 leaflets on each leaf stem.
- The leaves have smooth edges and pointed tips.
